## From wellness programs to advanced care

With three hospitals to choose from, Batavians have quick access to highly skilled medical practitioners just minutes from home.

### Delnor Hospital

Delnor Hospital is part of Delnor Health System, which provides a broad range of health care and wellness services for the community. Located minutes north of Batavia on Randall Road, this modern, 118-bed medical facility offers a state-designated Level II Trauma Center. Its 24-hour emergency department is staffed by physicians and nurses specially trained in emergency medicine. In addition, the modern labor/delivery/recovery suites are available in the hospital's NewLife Maternity center and high-risk newborns are cared for in a Level II nursery. Delnor is preparing for a three-story 100,000 square foot expansion designed to meet the needs of the growing community.

Other components of the system include the Delnor Health & Wellness Center, the LivingWell Cancer Resource Center, Delnor Glen Assisted Living and Town homes, and medical office buildings in Geneva, St. Charles, Batavia, Elburn and Sycamore.

### Central DuPage Hospital

Central DuPage Hospital is a nationally recognized 361-bed facility located east of Batavia in Winfield. It is a leading center for surgical innovations and was one of the first institutions in the nation to offer minimally invasive heart surgery, robotic-assisted surgery, minimally invasive spine surgery with bio-engineered bone protein and was the first Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit in DuPage County.

The hospital is part of an interdependent network of healthcare organizations and services, including convenient care centers,

**HISTORICAL FACT:** On Thanksgiving Day, 1940, a 25-bed hospital opened in St. Charles. The new facility was named Delnor Hospital after its generous benefactors Delora A. and Lester J. Norris. This beautiful hospital featured interiors designed by nationally-known interior decorator, Dorothy Draper, while the medical areas were equipped with the most up-to-date technology of the time. The building has undergone many changes and today houses Delnor Glen assisted living residents. The grounds have been expanded to include town homes where many independent residents reside.
